CALL FOR PAPERS COLLOQUIUM FOR FACULTY AND STUDENTS

This is the call for papers for the 7th Annual Colloquium on Quebec Studies to be held at Bishop's University on March 29 - 30, 2019. The title and overarching theme of the conference is: **Quebec Past and Present**. We invite researchers, academics and students from all disciplines in humanities and social sciences to contribute to this international and multidisciplinary conference. We are most interested in contributions from history, sociology, political science, public policy, linguistics, education, health, art and architecture. We encourage faculty to identify and encourage talented students to submit a proposal.

The aim of this colloquium is to provide a forum, where the participants can share their research knowledge and ideas on Quebec's past, its recent trends, and map out the directions for its future. The colloquium will result in the publication of select edited scholarly essays in the *Journal of Eastern Townships Studies* (JETS). Proposals must present original research and must not have been previously published.

If you are interested in submitting a proposal, send your abstract (max. 300 words) and CV before **December 1, 2018**. Please note that the working language of the colloquium, including paper presentations, is English.
